KAKUMA, KENYA ***A REFUGEE CAMP - A HOME***

Kakuma, Kenya, is home to over 160,000 people from about twenty countries, which have suffered or are suffering from war and conflicts. Approximately two-thirds of the refugees and asylum-seekers in Kenya have fled general insecurity in their respective countries since the 1990s. Our Salesian Missionaries have been living in the midst of the refugee camp for many years. This is unusual, yet this is the reality. We have five Salesian Missionaries in the midst of immense suffering who keep an open house of hope and consolation. Their very presence, their dedication and service to the refugees is truly the works of Don Bosco! They run a parish with several out-stations in which they take care of the spiritual needs of the Catholic refugees. They also have a technical school that teaches various subjects aimed at empowering the refugees. They learn skills that they can one day use to earn a living. Some examples of the training activities are: Cabinet Making, Basic Computer Skills, Masonry, Secretarial Studies, Carpentry, Metal Work, Basic English, Motor Vehicle Mechanics, Plumbing and Tailoring & Dressmaking. These are all simple trades that allow these young people to live a dignified life when they leave the refugee camp and once conditions of peace and of survival have been established in the places where they wish to go. Every day, food is provided for these young people. The Rector Major, Father Ángel Fernández Artime, SDB, ate with them sharing generous helpings of rice spiced with great joy and huge smiles. “They taught me about their little handiwork and what they were learning. I truly felt that they are in a true school that prepares them for life. They receive a simple education, which does not make it less valuable; indeed, it is quite the opposite, for they learn each day about living in communion with each other. They learn to live with others from such diverse backgrounds, to live in peace, valuing differences, respecting everyone’s opinion, and respecting the various expressions of culture”. People of the most diverse races, tribes, customs, and religious professions all live together. In the midst of this diversity, our brother Salesians of Don Bosco continue to be for many of them what Don Bosco was for his boys at Valdocco, Italy.”
